

Guy Loneragan serves as the interim Vice President for Research (VPR) and as a professor at Texas Tech University. He was awarded his BVSc from the University of Sydney and graduate (MS and PhD) degrees from Colorado State University with specialty in veterinary epidemiologist.

He began his academic career at West Texas A&M University in 2002. In 2010, Loneragan moved to Texas Tech University with a focus on scholarship where he enjoyed success. His interdisciplinary research has been primarily supported through competitive federal awards, and through industry sponsorship and philanthropy. Loneragan has served on a variety of national and international advisory groups including being appointed by the US Secretary of Agriculture to a National Advisory Committee, and to an appointment to a working group of the World Organization for Animal Health by its Director General.

In March of 2014, Loneragan joined the Office of the Vice President for Research (OVPR) as a faculty fellow and ultimately was appointed as interim VPR in April, 2016. He worked in a team-centered approach to align programs to offices, focus budgetary resources to needs, and work with wider groups on strategic priorities. The OVPR is a complex office that includes compliance, proposal support, development and submission, contracting with sponsors, and entrepreneurial programs. Loneragan – as a member of both the TTU faculty and staff communities – works to further enhance to experience for the staff within the OVPR and the faculty who interact with it.
